UC-wide and UC San Diego Goals: Non-Resident Students (domestic and international)

- University of California: Commission on the Future (*Nov. 2010*)
 - <u>Recommendation 8</u>: Increase Non-Resident Enrollment
- UC San Diego: Chancellor Fox's international mission and goals (*Dec. 2010*)
 - <u>Goal 2</u>: Increase the number of international scholars and students on campus; increase the engagement with these scholars and students in campus academic and social life.

• UC San Diego: Student Affairs' strategic goals (Sept. 2011)


- <u>Area 1</u>: Prepare, attract and enroll students of the highest capability who are representative of the diversity of the people of California.
- <u>Area 4</u>: Provide experiences that foster self-discovery and develop the personal, academic, and professional skills and relationships needed for a successful transition into diverse and global communities.

Methodology

- International students are defined as UC San Diego students who are NOT US citizens, PR, AM, RF, AS, AP or OT.
- Term GPAs from academic year 2010-2011 (FA10, WI11, and SP11).
- Use Week 3 registration data.
- Data source=Data Warehouse











Fall 2011: International Admissions & Enrollment Data














QUESTION #1B: How many international students were admitted to UC San Diego?












QUESTION #1C: How many international students <u>accepted</u> <u>the offer</u> to UC San Diego?













QUESTION #1D: How many international students <u>accepted</u> <u>the offer and registered</u> at UC San Diego?














QUESTION #1C: How many international students from China accepted the offer to UC San Diego?










QUESTION #1D: How many students from China accepted the offer and registered at UC San Diego?




ANNUAL CHANGE IN UN, GR, AND EAP CHINESE INTERNATIONALS REGISTERED FOR FALL QUARTER








Fall 2011: New Students












Fall 2011 Demographics: International Students at UC San Diego



Registered International Students=2,696








Fall 2011 Demographics: International Students at UC San Diego








Fall 2012: How many international students accepted the offer to UC San Diego?

Summary: Question #1

- UC San Diego's international student population is increasing progressively and will continue to do so in the near term.
 - Large and increasing numbers of students from China and South Korea are coming to UC San Diego.
 - Beginning Fall 2011, there were more international undergraduate students than international graduate students at UC San Diego—indicating a shift in the demographics of our international students.


















AY2010-2011: Distribution of Term GPAs



Fall 2011: SDCC English Course Enrollment




F1 FRESHMEN IN SDCC ENGLISH COURSES



Future Studies Needed

- What explains the paradox between Term GPA and performance SDCC courses
- Correlation between Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and indicators of academic achievement
- Correlation between Analytical Writing Placement Exam (AWPE) results
 and indicators of academic achievement







CONCLUSIONS

- UC San Diego's international student population is increasing progressively and will continue to do so in the near term.
 - Large and increasing numbers of students from China and South Korea are coming to UC San Diego.
- Relatively low percentages of international undergraduates are struggling academically.
 - Less than 10% have GPAs below 2.0 and about 7% have GPAs between 1.00-1.99.
- On average, our international undergraduates are succeeding academically on all indicators that we have examined to date, going back to Fall 2007.
 - About 10% have 4.0 GPAs.
 - More than 50% of students have GPAs between 3.00-3.99.
- Despite low marks in SDCC Courses, international undergraduate students are succeeding academically.
 - Average GPA is 3.31.
- This is a pattern that warrants a recalibration of the way we are providing services to ensure a high degree of student satisfaction.
